Please Explain the Membership

We have been getting questions in the regards to membership and guest fees. So, I am going to try to make it easier to understand if anyone has questions be feel free to call me.

This year all trail rides and playdays will have \$10.00 guest fees. The only trail ride that is different might be our Fall ride but we (as a Board) have not approached that subject yet.

A Family membership includes yourself, spouse (or live in companion) with dependents under 21 living with you. Any one other than what as stated above, is a guest and must pay all guest fees.

As a single membership you are allowed a companion or one guest for no charge, but a second companion will have to pay the guest fee.

If you have a family membership and no one in your family is joining with you to a trail ride but you can bring along a friend but you would be required to pay for the guest fee.
