Letter from The President:

The board and Betsy Faitz, Parade Chairperson, were hoping that at least (1) parade would remain viable, Grayslake, but as I am writing this letter, word came in that the parade has indeed been cancelled. This is disappointing but there is always next year. This month the scheduled trail rides will resume and continue each month there after that a ride is scheduled, as long as there are no changes to the state's restrictions. Some ride dates and or locations might change from what was originally scheduled, so watch for updates via the newsletter, emails or a call. Also you will find in this newsletter, "*Trail Ride Protocol*" in which Vickie Wancho, Trail Chairperson explains the procedures that the Lake County Mounted Posse will follow when hosting a club sponsored ride. As always, feel free to reach out to myself, Vickie or any board member with any questions you may have.

Even as the state enters Phase 4, some LCMP events will remain cancelled for this year and the board will make modifications to the ones we feel can still happen. This newsletter features some updates to the schedule. First and foremost is the safety, health plus the well-being of our membership.

With summer officially here, not just on the calendar but by the look and feel of the weather, it is time to start to return to some good trail riding, yummy delicious food and enjoying our friendships even with modifications

and social distancing in place. Let's plan to fully enjoy each bright warm sunny day to the fullest. Thank you for your patience and understanding during these unprecedented times in our club's history.

Finally, I want to mention that as we enter this new phase of re-opening, remember the local hometown businesses and restaurants that have been there for our club, supporting our events. Trail Ride News and Protocol

Well finally, the Posse wants to kick off our riding season. Yeah!!! Because of the COVID-19 virus, a new protocol with the serving of food is necessary. The Posse will supply the beverages of water, pop and tea, as usual. The food that is served will need to be individually packaged. For example, if you bring a dessert like brownies, cut them into individual serving sizes and put them in little baggies for our members to pick up without handling the pan. In addition, single serve snacks like chips, granola bars, cookies and other similar items are acceptable choices to have. The board is also asking that masks be worn while you are in line to get your food and to try to keep 6 feet distance from one another. The board understands that this is a pain, but we want our events to continue and to keep our members as safe as possible.

The first trail ride is July 12 at the Chain of Lakes. I will be sponsoring this ride. We *will not* have coffee and donuts in the morning, so plan accordingly. Meet at 9:00 am with a ride out at 9:30 am. I will be providing lunch around noon. If you choose to bring something to share, please make sure that it is individually wrapped. I am not asking for a dish to pass for this ride only if you choose to bring something. I am learning like everyone else, of the protocol to hosting an event. I will see what I come up with for how to serve the food. The Posse Board will have hand sanitizer, sanitizing wipes and gloves to keep things clean. Can't wait to see you all. Let's ride and have fun!!!
